There are a number of activities that can be completed with your child / children outlined below. Home learning activities can be brought into school anytime but should be in by Friday 17th May.

Activity 1

English:

Why not practise your descriptive writing by creating your own postcard describing a time when you've been to the beach. What did you see, hear, smell, taste and touch? Did you enjoy yourself, what things did you do? You can write about a real trip or why not let your imagination run wild?

Don't forget to include the picture on the back of your postcard.

Activity 2

Maths:

In a couple of weeks we will be looking at how tables and graphs can be used to show information.

Make a list of all the activities you could do at the seashore. Survey your friends and family to identify the 'Top five seashore activities' and display the results in a pictogram or bar chart.

Activity 3, Theme:

Here's the time to get as creative as you can, below are a couple of ideas that you could try out...

Make a miniature seashore garden using natural materials, such as pebbles, twigs, sand and shells.

Or...

Create a collage of a seaside scene using magazine pages.
