Impact:

Following the OFSTED inspection in March 2017 the provision for PE, Games & Sport was re-evaluated in time for the beginning of the academic year 2017-2018

An external Sports Coach & Consultant was employed to lead some PE lessons, lead Games & Sports activities in and after school and to take the lead role in involving KS2 children in as many of the areas activities as were on offer. An external PE provider was identified and asked to undertake a PE audit and recommend a system of assessment for the school to consider. Further outside providers were employed to lead specific activities. Staff were required to be working alongside these external providers in order to give them internal CPD opportunities.

The rural location of the school was a major factor (but not the only one) in spending a considerable amount of the grant on transport in order to enable children to attend events safely and not missing out because of personal transport issues.

At the end of the academic year children have attended 15 out of 17 area activities offered with approximately 78% of children in KS2 having taken part in one or more activity. This figure is 96.7% for year 6 and 86.7% for year 5, where a higher proportion of the events are aimed. 93.5% for year 4 and 34.4% for year 3.

The school now has a sporting profile within the area, children are increasingly enthusiastic and proficient in their activities and link sport with leading a healthier lifestyle.

Equipment has been purchased over the year thus allowing all children the opportunity to practise their skills in an ever increasing number of games.
