Almond is the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead and it is these members of staff you should contact in the first instance with any safeguarding concerns.


Bikes and Scooters





We have a diverse range of services, organisations and support groups attending our online Zoom sessions at different times throughout the day, evening and weekend (10am-9pm).




The aim of the event is to give attendees as much information, support and help as possible.
