

Dress code

Jewellery

Jewellery presents a health and safety risk during the school day. As such we request that children do not wear jewellery to school unless there is a medical reason.

Earrings

Children should only wear studs in their ears. These will need to be removed prior to the child being allowed to take part in PE. Teachers are no longer allowed to help children remove or insert earrings, nor are they allowed to allow children to participate in PE with tape over their earrings. We request that pupils have their ears pierced during the first weeks of the Summer Holidays so that they are able to remove ear rings upon their return to school.
