Mini Festival

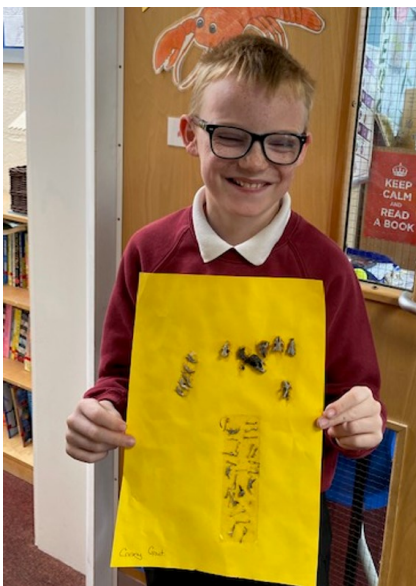
