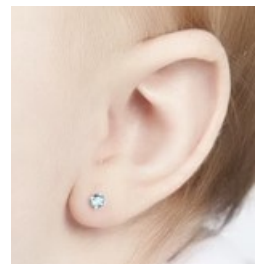
## Library visits

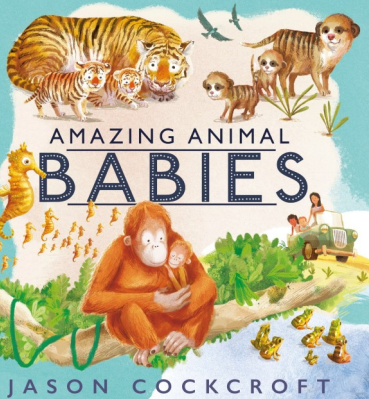


## Ear-rings/studs
