Our children are children to be proud of!

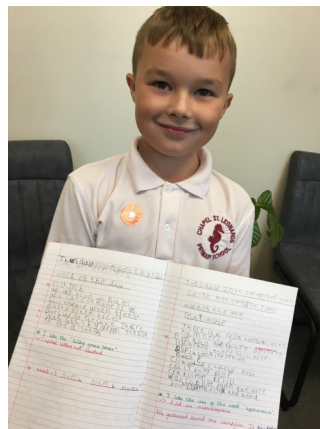

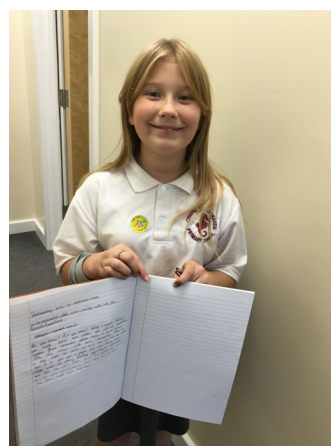
