### Parking

### Mobile Phones

As the children get older and may want to walk to and from school 'on their own' we understand parents and carers may wish for them to carry a mobile phone in case of an emergency. Children must bring any mobile phones to the School Office in the morning (switched off) and collect them from the School Office at the end of the school day. There are no circumstances in which children should have them with them during the school day and if this happens it is a breach of our Safeguarding policy.



### Pupil Premium Funding and Free School Meals

If you think that your child may be entitled to receive free school meals, then you are now required to apply for this online through Lincolnshire County Council. Even if your child is not eligible at the moment, if your circumstances change we will automatically be updated this will also mean your child continues to receive a free school meal in Key Stage 2 when universal infant school meals stops.
