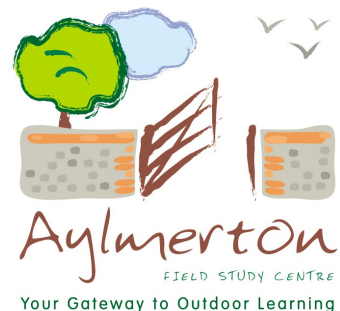

Please check your child weekly for lice

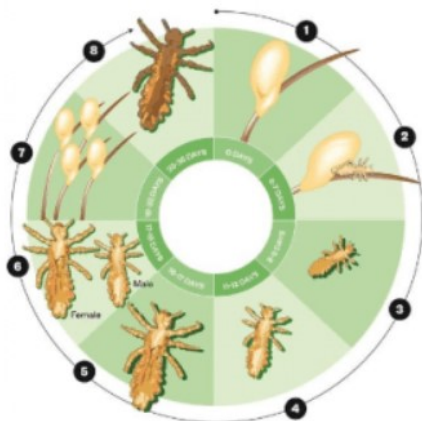


2: TREAT
