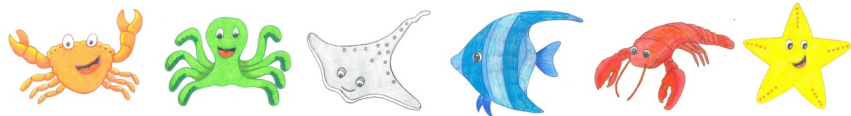
## Chapel Hockey Stars

There will be many more competitions through the year and it is our ambition that all children will attend a sports competition

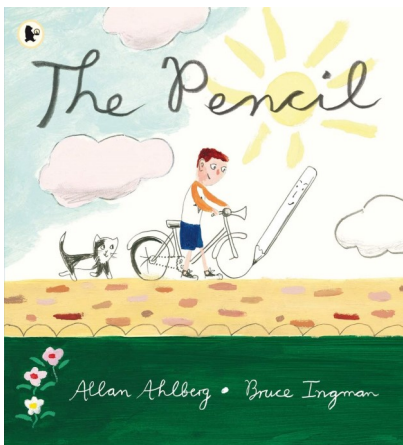
