## ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Illness does happen, especially at primary school, but please ensure you call the office to inform us if your child will be in school or not before 8:45am. Children are still able to attend school with a cough or cold.

Every moment in school counts.



Coughs/colds/ temperature/ sore throat	Children are able to attend school. Please give any medication, if required, at home before school.
Sickness and Diarrhoea	Children can return to school 48 hours after the last episode.
Chicken Pox	Children can return to school once all the scabs have crusted over.
Hand, foot and mouth	Children are able to attend school if they are feeling well.
Impetigo	Children can return to school 48 hours after antibiotic treatment has started or when all lesions are crusted and healed
Scarlet fever	Children can return 24 hours after starting appropriate medication
Headlice	Children are able to attend school as soon as treatment has been given.
Conjunctivitis	Children can attend school.
