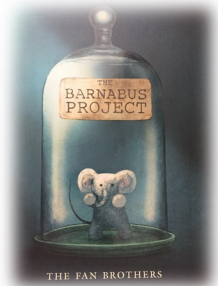
World Book Day Parents Event

We will be exploring the *Barnabus Project* by Fan Brothers. This is a beautiful story of bravery, courage and friendship with a message of acceptance and being happy being you.



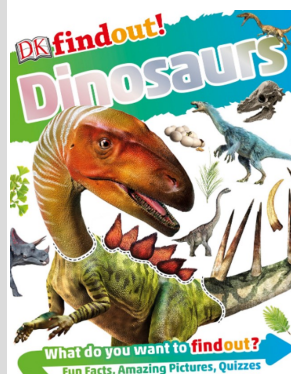
