



Remote Learning

If we are informed to close a class due to a potential COVID-19 exposure all learning will take place remotely on Microsoft Teams with everyone (including staff) working from home. If individual children are self isolating at home we will make sure there is provision for remote learning in place whilst understanding our class teachers are still in school teaching. We will also make arrangements for a School Meal Box for any children eligible for Free School Meals who are isolating due to potential exposure to a positive close contact or a positive test result.

Letters, money and slips

Please make sure you are using the red post boxes to send these items into school. This reduces the number of staff that have to handle items that are coming into school.

Free School Meals Eligibility

If you think that your child may be entitled to receive free school meals, then you are now required to apply for this online through Lincolnshire County Council. Even if your child is not eligible at the moment, if your circumstances change we will automatically be updated this will also mean your child continues to receive a free school meal in Key Stage 2 when universal infant school meals stops. We will also be able to provide a School Food Box delivered to you, at home, if your child has to self isolate for any reason.
