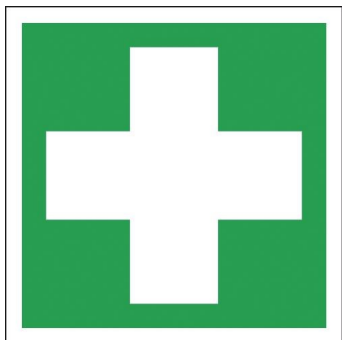

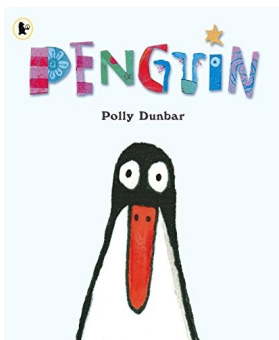
Communication

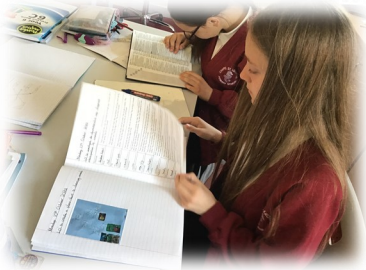
