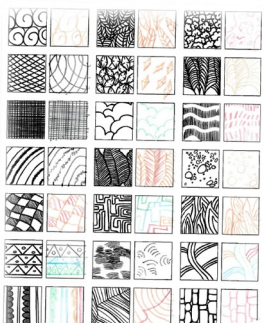


Dear Diary,
