

In Year 5 this half term we are studying WW2 so have linked some exciting home learning for your child/ren to do by **October 12**th. We ask that adults at home try and do some of the activities with the children and question their choices to provoke enjoyment and curiosity with learning – this really can make a difference.

Activity 1

English

Write a story based on based in a World War 2 setting. This could be based on War Horse, Goodnight Mr Tom, a fictional WW2 character or possibly a relative that was in the war.

Remember: Adjectives, powerful verbs, range of sentence starters and a range of punctuation.

Activity 2

Maths

Make a times table and/or division game that helps the players of the game work on all their times tables. You could do a board game like snakes and ladders – be imaginative.

Remember: The instructions so we can play it in class.

Activity 3

Theme

Make a model of something you have learned about during our World War 2 theme. This could be a scaled air raid shelter, a model of a tank or the Lancaster Bomber.

Remember: Be resourceful! You don't need specialist items; cereal packets and mud work just as well sometimes.
