

In Year 4 this half term we are studying The Anglo-Saxons and The Vikings so have linked some exciting home learning for your child/ren to do by October 12th. We ask that adults at home try and do some of the activities with the children and question their choices to provoke enjoyment and curiosity with learning – this really can make a difference.

Activity 1

English

Look at King Alfred's pledge: 'I desired to live worthily as long as I lived, and to leave after my life, to the men who should come after me, the memory of me in good works'. Write a pledge – how would you like to be remembered in the future?

Activity 2

Maths

Make a times table and/or division game that helps the players of the game work on all their times tables. You could do a board game like snakes and ladders – be imaginative.

Challenge: Can you link your game to our Anglo Saxon/ Viking theme?

Activity 3

Theme

Look at images of Anglo-Saxon coins. Can you design a coin?
You could draw a picture or use modelling clay or other materials to make your coin look like metal – use your imagination!

Remember: Be resourceful! You don't need specialist items; recycle items from around your home!
