

Isaac: working independently at home to make a Tommy: supporting other children in the class to develop mixture to share. their resilience skills.


Year 3 Shania: excellent work in Maths using subtraction. Alissia M: showing fantastic resilience in reading.


Each week will focus on defeating a different vegetable. In the first week back after the holidays it is the turn of the carrots: it's crunch time carrots!
